Stations of the Resurrection

The Via Lucis (Way of the Light) or the Stations of the Resurrection are a relatively recent idea, introduced by the Roman Catholic Church in the late 1970s. It is a liturgy which can be used in many different ways, throughout the whole of the Easter season- just as the Stations of the Cross take us on a journey with Christ as he travels to Golgotha, so the Stations of the Resurrection help us to follow his resurrection appearances.

In the name of the Father, and of the Son, and of the Holy Spirit. **Amen.** Alleluia. Christ is risen. **He is risen indeed. Alleluia.**

Sing for joy, O heavens, and exult, O earth; Break forth, O mountains, into singing! For the Lord has comforted his people, and will have compassion on his suffering ones.
